THE FOLLY OF KEEPING THE RELIGIOUS TRADITIONS OF MEN

At this season of the year religious people all over the world engage in all manner of religious activities in which they call attention to and honor the birth of Jesus of Nazareth, the Christ, to a virgin mother 2000 years ago in the city of Bethlehem. Religious organizations have all manners of special services, displays and events having to do with making this a much-honored time of special notice. A greater tribute to the memory of Jesus would be to obey His word that is contained in the New Testament. The Bible authorizes none of these birth honoring religious activities. The only thing that the New Testament teaches should be done is the weekly memory of the death of Jesus by eating the ceremonial feast that He instituted on the night before He was crucified at Jerusalem. Not a word is said in the entire Bible, about commemorating the birth of Jesus. All who do commemorate the birth of Jesus do so absolutely without Bible authority. It would be a far greater tribute to Jesus for us to obey His teachings by doing what He stated that he wanted done rather than doing things that Jesus did not authorize. The date of the birth of Jesus is not recorded and is unknown. No New Testament writer ever indicated that the birth of Jesus was to be celebrated. It is hard to see honor of Jesus in the behavior of those who ignore what Jesus commanded but do what He did not command. Jesus commanded all to become repentant, baptized believers. Jesus commanded that all be taught to observe what Jesus commanded His apostles in the first century, (Matthew 28:19,20), but Jesus never did command anybody to observe His birthday as a day of religious celebration or worship. True love for Jesus Christ is, according to Jesus, shown by doing what Jesus Christ said to do. John 14: 15 "If you love me, keep my commandments." John 15: 10 "If you keep my commandments, you shall abide in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments, and abide in his love." Luke 6: 46 "And why call you me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?" Matthew 15: 8 "This people draws near to me with their mouth, and honors me with [their] lips; but their heart is far from me. 9 But in vain they do worship me, teaching [for] doctrines the commandments of men". Mark 7: 6 "He answered and said to them, Well has Esaias prophesied of you hypocrites, as it is written, This people honors me with [their] lips, but their heart is far from me. 7 Howbeit in vain do they worship me, teaching [for] doctrines the commandments of men. 8 For laying aside the commandment of God, you hold the tradition of men, [as] the washing of pots and cups: and many other such like things you do. 9 And he said to them, Full well you reject the commandment of God, that you may keep *your own tradition*". The extent to which religious people are willing to show a lack of respect for what Jesus taught is starkly demonstrated by the almost universal world wide acceptance of the doctrines of men concerning the celebration of this season as the birth of Jesus Christ in the absolute absence of any New Testament teaching to support any of it. If Jesus wanted His birth celebrated that would be taught in the New Testament just as eating the Lord's supper is taught in the New Testament. Jesus told His disciples that the Holy Spirit would guide them into all truth and would glorify Jesus. John 16: 12 "I have yet many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. 13 Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, [that] shall he speak: and he will show you things to come. 14 He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall show [it] to you." This was the work of the Holy Spirit yet the Holy Spirit did not guide the apostles to observe the birthday of Jesus. There is no indication in the New Testament that the disciples ever made any observance whatsoever of the birthday of Jesus Christ. That leads to the inescapable conclusion that observing a birthday of Jesus is not part of the "all truth" that the Holy Spirit was to guide the disciples into, nor was it part of **glorifying Jesus**. Celebration of this season by Christians would not be absent from the New Testament record if it were a way to glorify Jesus Christ that had the approval of God. Whatever you personally do with this season is up to you but you certainly do not have any Bible support to claim for it any religious significance because the Bible does not teach it. The inspired scriptures furnish us with instructions for <u>all good works</u>. 1Timothy 3: 16 "All scripture [is] given by inspiration of God, and [is] profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: 17 That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished to all good works". The fact that the inspired scriptures do not have any instructions for observing a birthday of Jesus, while at the same time claiming to guide the godly into all good works indicates that in the estimation of God observing a birthday of Jesus is not a good work. The New Testament emphasizes the life, the teachings and the atoning death of Jesus. 1Corinthians 1: 23 "But we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumblingblock, and to the Greeks foolishness; 24 But to them which are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God, and the wisdom of God. 1Corinthians 2: 2 "For I determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified. Galatians 6: 14 "But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified to me, and I to the world." During this season the emphasis for most religious people is on creating scenes with donkeys, sheep and costumes in churchyards and parking lots. Churches are having ceremonies, decorations, blessings of this and that and parades through church buildings, all of which are the doctrines and customs of men that are not taught in the New Testament and are not part of faithful worship of God. Since the Christians in the New Testament under the guidance of the inspired apostles of Jesus Christ pleased God by not celebrating a birthday of Jesus Christians today cannot celebrate a birthday of Jesus without failing to abide in the teachings of the Jesus Christ. The scripture condemns going beyond what Jesus Christ taught. 2John 1:9 "Whosoever transgresses and abides not in the teaching of Christ, has not God: he that abides in the teaching, the same has both the Father and the Son." If Jesus taught that His followers should make a religious observance of His birthday, where did Jesus teach it? There is no record in the New Testament of Jesus ever teaching that. The followers of Jesus can all be one, but they can only be one if they all abide in the teachings of the New Testament only.

A church may be subject to Jesus Christ only by obeying the New Testament only. The minute a church stops obeying the New Testament only that church stops being subject to Jesus Christ. How can any claim to be subject to a person whose will they do not obey? The New Testament is the only will of Jesus Christ that we have. If we do not obey the New Testament we are not subject to Jesus Christ.

Why is the University Heights Church of Christ what it is? Is the University Heights Church of Christ what it is because of following what the New Testament says? "Of Christ" means that.
