A TIME TO LAMENT

On May 27 I watched a phone video shot two days earlier of George Floyd suffocating in the street as a police officer knelt on his neck for nearly nine minutes. Since then I have watched numerous videos of policemen, store owners, peaceful protesters, rioters, and other people shot, beaten to death, and run over by cars. I have listened to numerous interviews of people barely able to speak through their tears mourning the loss of loved ones and livelihoods as violent riots rage through their neighborhoods. I have listened to a number of testimonials from folks as they describe the injustices perpetrated against them based upon their skin color. I have watched a homeless man mocked as rioters burned his only possessions to ash. I have watched and listened to numerous politicians attempt to score political points during the events of the last several days. Frankly, it's all horrifying.

Social media has exploded like I've never seen. *Everyone* seems to have something to say. Many Christians are speaking up with wise counsel and I am very grateful for their contribution. (As an example, I encourage you to read brother David's Facebook post from a few days ago)

For my own part, I am angry at the injustice and the violence I see and read about on a nightly basis. I am moved by the impassioned pleas and sorrowful tears of those battling racism and other injustices. More than anything, though, I am sad.

I am sad that those made in the image of God, specifically designed to rule over his creation in a noble, pure, and holy manner, have made such a terrible mess of it.
