Either way, it was unexpected and can change everything.

The title of this article is an expression we've all heard, perhaps used ourselves. Here's another one: "Man plans, and God laughs." We won't find those exact words in Scripture but we certainly find the idea expressed a number of times. For instance, take a moment to read Psalm 2:1-3, 2 Kings 18:33-35...19:32-37, Luke 12:13-21, and James 4:13-17.

Bob Trumpy, a former Bengals tight end and long-time host of "Sport's Talk" in Cincinnati, was fond of the expression, "You just never know." The French have the expression, "C'est la vie", which means "That's life" or "Such is life." Chuck Berry wrote a song by that title in 1960. It's been recorded or performed by a number of musicians over the years, Bob Seger being the one I've heard sing it most. An oft repeated line in the song goes, "C'est la vie say the old folks, it goes to show you never can tell."

Each one of these expressions speak to a truth man has known for a very long time. The direction of our lives can change instantly. In such turbulent waters and upon such shifting sands, something solid and immoveable is invaluable. Enter God. Hebrews 6:17-19a offers extraordinary insight into

So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it with an oath, so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us. We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul."

No truth is sweeter to the child of God than knowing that, in the midst of a world that delights in throwing us curveballs out of left field (why stop now with the expressions?), our God remains unchanged and unchangeable. Take a moment to read the deeply encouraging lyrics to "We Have An Anchor." It's number 496 in the song book and based upon the passage above.

No doubt life will continue to surprise, dismay, and sometimes confuse us. God will be what He has always been. Praise Him for that!
