It's always good to read God's Word. Aimless reading reads a chapter or two from this book, another chapter from another book the next day, and a few verses from another book the next. It's good that Scripture was read, but not particularly helpful. Purposeful reading brings a plan. There is a goal in mind. It cares about context, both of the passage and, as far as it can be determined, of the people to whom it was originally written. There is great benefit in this.

Paul's primary concern in 1 Corinthians 9:24-27 was his own manner of living. He spoke of disciplining himself and bringing his body under control. The aimless manner of Christian life does some good things here and there but hasn't really developed a plan for it. It's hit and miss, hot and cold. The purposeful Christian life is consistent, focused, and steady. It's not perfect, but it has a plan in place. Better yet, it's following the plan God has set in place in Scripture.
