BENIGN SIN?

There's a popular mindset that goes something like this. "Look. My behavior is not hurting anybody. Why don't you go talk to someone who is actually hurting other people?" This suggests that no sin is worth mentioning unless it is actively injuring someone. Some seem to believe there is such a thing as benign sin.

When challenged, something like this follows: "Well, explain to me who I'm hurting." We can start with the individual sinner. In 1 Corinthians 6:9-10 we read, Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. Some of these sins do not involve a second party. One can be sexually immoral alone. An idolater need not involve another. Greed can easily be an individual sin. A drunkard may drink himself senseless behind closed doors without involving another soul. Even so, "who am I hurting?" is answered resoundingly in this passage. Self is being destroyed because the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God. Should a further statement be necessary we find it in verse 11. And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God. If such activity were not hurting at least the individual there would be no need for washing, sanctifying, and justifying.

Beyond this, I do not accept that the only one being injured by sin is the sinner. While there *may* be instances where such is the case, I suspect they are few and far between. If one socializes in "normal" ways (school, work, church, family, friends, neighbors, etc.) they will wield some influence among those around them. What is their influence and example saying to those
