KIDS, KIDS, AND MORE KIDS!

A couple of Sunday's ago, during the talk at the Lord's table in the morning service, it seemed like all of the young children began, as if on cue, talking at once. I couldn't help but smile. Evelyn popped her little head up trying to find everyone and began chattering even louder. Parent or not, its hard not to chuckle at that.

The psalmist declared, Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward. Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth. Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them! (Psalm 127:3-5a) What a blessing they are!

For the size of this congregation, we are richly blessed with children here at University Heights. Several of us have been members of larger congregations with far fewer children. In preparing for this article, I asked Jackie to help me count the number of children five years old or younger at Uheights. We came up with 9 before counting babies Patton and Martin who, Lord willing, will be here soon. That will be 11 children under the age of five. That number grows to 17 if we move up to ten years old and younger. If 80 people attend a worship assembly and 17 of them are ten or younger, that represents between 21 and 22% of the attendees. That is very heartening and reason for optimism as one considers the future of this congregation.

As wonderful as children are, they can be a handful for mom and dad. This is especially true inside a church building and during an assembly. Most times when I'm preaching, I can
