WILL WE BE LIKE PAUL?

The apostle Paul was prepared to make his defense. None stood with him. When Herod gave him permission to speak none expected what they heard. If he was ashamed, he did not show it. If he was awed by them, it was not evident. If they expected groveling, they didn't get it. What they heard was the gospel.

Paul's whole manner moved governor Festus to cry out, Paul, you are out of your mind; your great learning is driving you out of your mind. To Festus, Paul must have been insane. Perhaps he thought his outburst would rattle the chained apostle and cause him to remember his place. Instead, Paul calmly responded, I am not out of my mind, most excellent Festus, but I am speaking true and rational words. (Acts 26:25)

Then Paul turned his attention to the most powerful man in the room. For the king knows about these things, and to him I speak boldly. For I am persuaded that none of these things has escaped his notice, for this has not been done in a corner. King Agrippa, do you believe the prophets? I know that you believe. Paul invited Agrippa to become a Christian. That's what this entire scene was about. Curious Agrippa just wanted to hear Paul's case. (Acts 25:21-22) Paul seized on this and several of the highest dignitaries in the land got to hear the gospel.

Agrippa himself was taken aback. *In a short time would* you persuade me to be a Christian? Whether Agrippa was

What was Paul? He was washed and cleansed by the blood of Jesus Christ (Ephesians 1:7). He knew Jesus Christ, (Philippians 3:8) gazed upon all the pomp and pageantry in the room along with its fancy titles and honorifics, and knew they were rubbish (Philippians 3:8). Paul knew that all need Christ.

In the years to come I believe Christians will be called to answer for their faith more than has previously occurred in this country. As our nation moves further down the ugly path it is on, Christians will be put on "trial" before officials, friends, family, classmates, and coworkers to explain their actions and beliefs. Let us use those times as Paul used them, opportunities to turn attention to Jesus Christ by explaining the reason for the hope that is in us. (1 Peter 3:14-15)
