"THE GUARDS TREMEBLED"

"Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightening, and his clothing white as snow. And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men." (Matthew 28:1-4)

What must it have been like to have been a guard at Jesus' tomb that morning? You would have been assigned to the post specifically to ensure his body remained in that tomb. The chief priests and Pharisees had asked Pilate to station you there. Pilate's response provided your mandate. *"You have a guard of soldiers. Go, make it as secure as you can." So they went and made the tomb secure by sealing the stone and setting a guard.* (Matthew 27:65-66) As a trained Roman soldier you know your duty and can perform it very effectively.

Adding further incentive to ensuring Jesus' body remained in the tomb is the punishment you can expect if you fail in your task. Rome is not tolerant for guards who fail in their task. Herod had all the guards assigned to Peter executed after an angel released him from prison. (Acts 12:6-19) When the jailor in Philippi thought the prisoners under his charge had escaped, he was prepared to fall on his own sword. (Acts 16:27-28) When the ship transporting
