#### THE HOLY SPIRIT AND THE SINNER

What causes a person to recognize they need cleansing from sin and salvation? Why does a person ever become a Christian in the first place? Why did we make such a choice? I suspect our answers would sound rather uniform. We were taught the message of Jesus Christ, studied scripture for ourselves, came to believe it, came to faith in Jesus Christ, and became Christians as a result of that faith. This is Romans 1:16, right? Yet consider that without the Holy Spirit we would have no scripture to study, no knowledge of Jesus Christ, and no revealed power of God for salvation.

We learned in an earlier article that the Holy Spirit revealed the Word of God. He influences the hearts and minds of unbelievers through that Word. How often have we seen it play out, even in our own lives? Paul declared, "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." (Romans 1:17) Now start in verse 5 and note the number of Old Testament quotes and allusions leading up to verse 17. Do you see how they are in almost every verse? The Spirit put them there. Whether Moses, David, Isaiah, or Paul the Holy Spirit was guiding their pen. However many have been won to faith in Jesus Christ as a result of these passages and others, it may properly be stated that they were influenced by the Holy Spirit.

Let's pursue this a bit further. Take a moment to read John 16:7-15. At this point in John's gospel Jesus has concluded his public ministry and was preparing his apostles for his death. He also speaks of what would occur among

Visit us on Facebook, YouTube, or our website to watch or listen to sermons. them after he had ascended. Note his teaching on the Holy Spirit here. When the Spirit ("Helper") was sent to the apostles, he would convict the world concerning sin, righteousness, and judgment. In verses 9-11 he offers additional information on each of those three points (sin, righteousness, judgment). Look at it again and notice that the convicting would come through revelation. The Spirit would reveal truths about these things which would result in convicted hearts. When we bring verses 12-15 into the equation, we see that Jesus was connecting the convicting work of the Holy Spirit with his guiding the apostles into all truth. To put it another way, the work of verses 8-11 would be accomplished through the promise of verses 12-15. Why was the early church so devoted to the apostle's doctrine (Acts 2:42)? John 16:7-15 is why!
