God said two things to Cain about sin in Genesis 3:7 that I want to consider with you. "If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door. Its desire is contrary to you, but you must rule over it." In this article we will consider the statement, "Its desire is contrary to you." Sin is so easy to commit. It can be done with little to no thought. It can present itself to us as something so appealing. It plays to our carnal appetites and promises fun, gain, and fulfilment if we'll just give in to the temptation. It urges us to notice how "everyone else is doing it" and question whether there is really any sense in refraining? It encourages us to cast a critical eye toward God and wonder if it is even fair for Him to withhold certain things from us? "Did God actually say..." don't do this or that? (Genesis $3: 1 \mathrm{~b}$ ) As one man said in my hearing several years ago in justifying his sin, "We're all sexual beings with urges. Sue me for doing what I'm preprogrammed to do."

Sin is always contrary, or against, us. It never has our best interest at heart. It separates us from God and is the reason Jesus died on the cross. Let us never blind ourselves to the deceptive nature of $\sin$. (Hebrews $3: 13$ ) It caresses the conscience with half-truths and reasonable
